The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Orchard Park was held on Monday, July 8, 2019 in the Municipal Center, 4295 South Buffalo Street, Orchard Park, New York. Mayor Clinton called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

- Code Enforcement Officer John Gullo had nothing to report.
- Manager of Public Works Wittmeyer reported that brush pickup will be less frequent while the DPW crew is busy with road projects, which should be completed by July 23. He also reported that West Highland Avenue will be closed for a short time during paving.
- Trustee McNatty called attention to the Village crosswalks where pedestrians have the right of way, asking drivers to be cautious.
- Deputy Mayor Hartung reported on the upcoming Summer in the Park events July 26th and 27th. The Ice Cream Social is Friday night behind the Middle School and the Street Dance Saturday is in the parking lot behind Key Bank. Deputy Mayor Hartung also reported on upcoming Hazard Waste Drop-off Events.
- Trustee Hogenkamp reported on the Summer in the Park events, mentioning the Friday night fireworks and need for volunteers to scoop ice cream.
- Clerk Treasurer Jensen had nothing to report.
- Attorney Marshall reported on a group that will be going door to door asking for donations in the Village, NYPIRG. Whether someone chooses to make a

contribution or not, they should be aware that 38-40% of what is collected is paid to the people knocking on doors.

Chapter 163, Filming and Photography

Private Property

Type I Permits	\$ 500 per day
Type II Permits	\$1,500 per day
Type III Permits	\$3,250 per day

Public Property

Type II Permits	\$2,000 per day
Type III Permits	\$4,000 per day

Special Conditions are determined at the discretion of the Village Clerk and are outlined in detail in the Village Code (Chapter 163-4). Multi-day productions lasting longer than 5 days will receive a 20% discount in fees.

Please refer to Chapter 163 of the Village code for further explanation and clarification.
